SWITCHED



ow we treat others matters...deeply. Jesus repeatedly speaks about the importance of truth and love in the gospels, proclaiming that the greatest commands are to "love God" and "love others." And in John 13:34-35 (NIV), He notes that love is a clue through which the world will discern His true followers:

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

This leaves Christians with an important command and a divine responsibility. Consider that Christ doesn't only command us to love those who love us; the Bible clearly speaks about the importance of loving and praying for our "enemies" as well.

That person who frustrates you? You're called to pray for him or her. That person who mistreats you? You're called to love him or her. This can be

First and foremost, it's important to love others and to forgive.

difficult to live out, and we can see this struggle perfectly illustrated in "Switched," a film about two high school girls who are forced to see the world through one another's eyes.

One of the girls, Katie Sharp, cruelly mocks Cassandra Evans. Cassandra, who was desperate and frustrated, prays that Katie

would know what it's like to walk in Cassandra's shoes. Suddenly, the two switch places and find themselves on quite the journey.

The characters' experiences teach us some powerful lessons. First and foremost, it's important to love others — and to forgive. Forgiving allows us to let go of any anger we feel and to no longer be controlled by the frustration and pain that takes root when others hurt us. Beyond that, Katie and Cassandra teach us to have empathy and compassion for others.

We don't know what people face in their lives or why they are the way they are, so remembering these tidbits as we interact with difficult people is very important. In the end, "Switched" filmmakers Andrea Polnaszek and Alexandra Boylan (bonus: read what they have to say here) are hoping the

film helps fans live out the biblical command to love others and to show compassion for everyone, even those who frustrate us.



here are always consequences to what we say and do. And while it's easy to focus on "consequences" in a negative sense, a consequence can also be a positive. After all, it's essentially the result or impact of any condition, statement or action.

Let's start with some positive examples: Consider that the consequence for a good report card might be a special surprise, and the consequence for hard work might mean your success paying off — and the list goes on.

Plus, when you say or do something uplifting for someone, it can spark joy, love, excitement or contentment. What we say and do — and how we say and do it — matters.

Proverbs and James are just two books of the Bible that talk about consequences, particularly when it comes to the tongue and power of words. Proverbs 15:4 (NIV) reads, "The soothing tongue is a tree of life, but a perverse tongue crushes the spirit." And here's a convicting portion of James 3:5-6 (NIV):

"Likewise, the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole body, sets the whole course of one's life on fire..."

In "Bernie the Dolphin," we see both positive and negative consequences for Holly and Kevin, the two young siblings who embark on a mission to save Bernie. We see them learn a lesson early on in the film when they have a close call on their kayak — and we also see the positive consequences of their kind willingness to help protect Bernie and his family.

In addition to reflecting on the positive and negative consequences of our thoughts and actions, "Bernie the Dolphin" also reminds us to persist and carry on, even when things get difficult. One example is when Holly encourages her brother to pursue his video-making dreams.

We also see characters invoke prayer at a few difficult moments throughout the movie, reminding us that we can turn to God when we have difficult choices to make about what to say or how to behave — especially when we aren't sure of the coming consequences.

Abby, the kids' mom, reminds her husband that parents should invoke God for their kids' wellbeing as well — for success, good health and that they do the right thing.

"We teach them the best that we can and pray that they make the right choices," she proclaims in the film. Let's think through the consequences of our thoughts and actions this week, while also looking for ways we can bless others just like Holly and Keven sought to help Bernie.

DISCUSSION uestions

What did Holly and Kevin learn about consequences? What did the kids learn about the importance of standing up for what's right? Why do our words and actions matter so deeply? Can you think of a time when you said something you regret? Share and reflect. Why do you think James (author of the New Testament book) calls the tongue a "fire?"





PROJECTOR AND SCREEN OPTIONS

If you really want to make it a grand event, you can find a projector that fits your budget and is compatible with the technology you have. There are plenty of options that fit a range of budgets, from a \$55 projector with built-in speakers to a \$210 kit with remote and tripod.

After you have the tech and are ready to project the movie, it's time to construct your screen. The simplest solution is to hang a white sheet (maybe an old sheet from your bed or a painter's drop cloth) on your garage door, side of your house or over your fence.

There are other options as well. Consider something a bit more complex and get the kids and family involved in the construction. You can design the screen together as a family, budget for materials and then head to the store to get what you need. It could be as simple as sheets over a dowel or it can be PVC pipe collapsible unit.

If construction isn't your thing, there are outdoor screens available for purchase or rent.

COURTING MOM & DAD



stering good relationships with our family members means finding a balance for our time, caring for others' feelings and, most importantly, putting God at the center of all we do. Whether it's a relationship between a husband and wife, siblings or parents and children, love, compassion and respect are key.

The first lesson we can take away from "Courting Mom and Dad" is that families should be praying for one another — husbands for wives, wives for husbands, parents for children — and children for parents.

When the kids in "Courting Mom and Dad" approach their Uncle Paul for help, he reminds them of the importance of prayer, especially when it comes to the healing process. We can use the same reminder in our own lives. As families, we should pray for one another — in good times and in bad. Ephesians 6:18 (NIV) proclaims:

"And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people."

Another consideration in the film: It's easy to see how life can get so busy and complex that we move God out of the center and put success, career and other things of lesser value in His place. But, as we see in the film, this can be a dangerous and problematic habit.

The Bible tells us it's essential to put God in the center of our marriages and our families. If you're struggling in this area, don't worry! It's never too

late to recalibrate and think deeper about how we can fix the current state of our marriages and families — and it's a very good idea for us to routinely pray over and ponder how we can do better, even when things are going well.

Finally, part of having a healthy family means setting our priorities. In "Courting Mom and Dad," Brent's unfortunate habit of

not putting family first has a negative impact on his wife and family. Brent's priorities are all out of order, and we see his wife reacting to that reality.

At one point, he admits: "If I wasn't so preoccupied with my work I would have spent more time with my wife and I wouldn't be in this position." So, let's remember to put God first, to pray and to set our priorities. These are important steps for every member of the family to take.





- ☐ **Favorite toppings** anything goes, for our pizzas we used pepperoni, green bell peppers, black olives, Roma tomatoes and oregano

INSTRUCTIONS

If using homemade dough, after it has risen, punch it down and divide it into two equal sized balls. Follow the directions on the package for store-bought dough.

Grease two cookie sheets/pizza pans.

Spread one piece of divided dough on each pan. Shape one like a Christmas Tree and the other like a Candy Cane.

Use the sauce, cheese and other toppings to decorate.

Bake and serve!

Note: baking times vary by dough thickness. Typical baking time is 8-12 minutes in a 425° to 450° oven.

We see this in "Operation Christmas List" when it comes to Barney's quest to get the bike of his dreams. He becomes so clouded by his wants

that he hatches a plan that violates what's right, seeks to cheat the system and puts himself and his friends in danger.

Along the way, he realizes that he hurt others, including his friend Iris. "You used me," she sadly proclaims at one point in the film, as she realized that she was just

part of his plan to get what he wanted. In the end, though, Barney has a profound change-of-heart.

After lots of hijinks and chaos, we see him come to a realization: the bike of his dreams really isn't the most important thing. "I don't need the bike," he says at the end of the movie. "Some things are worth more than a bike."

Barney's heart is so changed for the better that he gives up his dream of getting the bike and instead gets a gift for his mom and surprises a little girl with the gift of her dreams. A lot of us are like Barney — or we at least find ourselves behaving in similar ways at various moments.

The Bible has a lot to say when it comes to greed and the impact it can have on our hearts and minds. Jesus reminds us in Luke 12:15 (NIV) about the importance of avoiding greed in our lives: "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions." And Christ again addresses this issue in Matthew 6:24 (NIV):

"No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money."

Let's remember not to let greed overtake us, and let's guard our hearts against lying and using others. Barney's experience teaches us a lot about how we, too, should behave.



e are called to love others, including those we dislike and even our "enemies." With this command in mind, the Bible encourages us to see the inherent value in each and every person. But it doesn't just end there, as Paul reminds us of something else in Philippians 2:3-4: that we should also value others above ourselves.

Those verses read as follows (NIV):

"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others."

We see these themes lived out repeatedly throughout "Hachi: A Dog's Tale." The beautiful, heartbreaking and encouraging story surrounds a professor named Parker Wilson and his wife, Cate. We see Cate selflessly give in after repeatedly making it clear that she didn't want to keep Hachi after her husband discovered the dog at a local train station.

Value others above ourselves. This is a difficult lesson to live out, but one that comes with time and intentionality.

That selflessness and devotion based on the love and joy she saw her husband experience with Hachi by his side — was also seen throughout the film when Hachi waited for Parker each day at the train station, often chasing after him once he left the house to go to work.

Even after Parker died, Hachi's devotion carried on, as he waited each day at the train station in desperate hopes of seeing his owner until the dog also died.

This selflessness was best explained by Parker's and Cate's grandson, who was deeply moved by Hachi's love for his grandpa.

"I never met my grandfather. He died when I was just a baby," he said at the end of the film. "But when I hear about him and Hachi, I feel like I know him. They taught me the meaning of loyalty, and that you should never forget anyone you've loved."

All of this brings us back to our original lesson: value others above ourselves. This is a difficult lesson to live out. but one that comes with time and intentionality (i.e. trying to be better at it). Think of ways this week that you can take steps to love others above yourself.

White Chocolate Party Popcorn

Ingredient List:

- □ **12 cups popped popcorn** light or no butter microwaveable works best
- □ 1lb bag of white chocolate chips or melting chocolate
- Sprinkles, M&M's, Reese's Pieces, Junior Mints, or Sugary Cereal — whatever your favorite treat is!

INSTRUCTIONS

Pop the popcorn per bag instructions, divide onto parchment paper lined baking sheets.

Melt chocolate chips or melting chocolate in the microwave in 30-second intervals so you don't burn the chocolate. Stir in between each round of heating.

Once melted, use a spoon to drizzle the chocolate over the popcorn making sure to coat every last pop!

Immediately add your candy of choice, let cool slightly and serve!

Store in an airtight container for up to a week ... if it lasts that long.

Puppy Chow

Warning: uses peanut butter, but you can substitute with a non-nut butter.

Ingredient List:

1 (12oz) box of Chex Rice Cereal
$1\frac{1}{2}$ cups semisweet chocolate chips
3/4 cup smooth peanut butter — or non-nut butter
6 Tbsp of unsalted butter
1/4 to 1/2 tsp salt — to your taste
1½ tsp vanilla extract
2 ½ cups powdered sugar, divided

INSTRUCTIONS

Pour the cereal into one large bowl and line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper.

Put the chocolate, peanut butter, butter and salt in a large microwave safe bowl and melt together — heat in 20-30 second intervals, stirring in between. Repeat until fully combined and ingredients are smooth.

Add the vanilla extract to the peanut butter and chocolate mixture.

Pour the mixture over the cereal in the bowl and mix thoroughly.

Time to layer: Pour 1 cup powdered sugar into a plastic bag. Add half the cereal mixture then 1 cup powdered sugar, the remaining cereal and the last ½ cup of powdered sugar.

Seal the bag! And shake until cereal is evenly coated with sugar.

Pour onto the lined baking sheet to cool.

Store in an airtight container for up to 1 week.

Chex Mix

This one is easy and a sure-fire crowd pleaser.

Ingredient List:

3 cups EACH of Wheat, Rice, and Corn Chex Cereal
2 cups Cheez-It Crackers
2 cups mini pretzels
1 cup Cheerios
1 cup peanuts — OR broken rye chips if there's a peanut allergy
$1 \frac{1}{2}$ sticks butter ($\frac{3}{4}$ cup total)
1/3 cup Worcestershire sauce
1 Thsp seasoned salt — this is where the flavor is, don't use regular table salt!

□ **3 tsp garlic powder** — or measure it with

your heart.

Preheat oven to 250 degrees.

In a large, deep pan (roasting pan, dutch oven) add the butter and seasoning. Let it melt in the oven while it preheats.

Mix all the dry ingredients in a large bowl.

Remove the pan, add the dry ingredients and stir to coat the cereal in the seasoned butter.

Bake for 15 minutes, stir and repeat another 3 times for a total of 1 hour of roasting.

Lay out paper towels or a brown paper bag and dump the mixture, allow to cool.

Store in airtight containers for up to 2 weeks!

t's never too late to change. Remember that Jesus is all about second chances; this reality is beautifully told throughout the Bible. Still, it's easy to fall into a pattern of forgetting — or of wrongly assuming that the mistakes we've made have somehow separated us from God's love.

We see these struggles unfold in "Beyond the Mask," as William Reynolds attempts to change his ways after meeting Charlotte Holloway, a woman with whom he falls in love.

"Only God can give us new lives," Charlotte tells William at one point in the film. And a different point when William tries to win Charlotte's love, another character delivers some phenomenal advice. "Charlotte will not be moved by revenge," the man said, encouraging William to seek "redemption" instead and adding, "There's only one Man with the power to make you new."

2 Corinthians 5:17-19 (NIV) beautifully encapsulates this message. It reads:

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation."

The entire story focuses on William's quest to create an honorable reputation and to leave behind his checkered past. His ability to change his heart and his life leaves us all with an important reminder: that we, too, can change — and that God is always there with open arms waiting for us to come to Him.

If you've struggled or made errors in your life, don't despair. Instead, turn to Jesus. Seek Him daily and work to be more like Him. Christianity is about a relationship, not a set of do's and don'ts. The closer we grow to Jesus in daily Bible reading and prayer, the more we become like Him.

Remember: we can't earn salvation. Charlotte so eloquently described this in "Beyond the Mask" when she proclaimed, "Don't you know that neither redemption nor love can either be earned?" Let's remember this lesson in our own lives as well.

God is always there with open arms waiting for us to come to Him





here are two key reminders at the core of "Sweet Inspirations": that God can ease our fears, and that we are called to carry out God's love in the kind deeds we do.

Let's first begin by examining fear. It's no secret that life can sometimes feel overwhelming or confusing — two dynamics that are sure to spark fear in our hearts. While being scared is normal, the Bible calls us to remember God's promise amid our fears: that no matter what happens, He is with us.

We are reminded of the Lord's goodness in Isaiah 41:10 (NIV):

"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

So, while life can sometimes throw us lemons — situations that seem difficult or insurmountable — we should never give up hope. With God, anything is possible. That's an important lesson we see play out in "Sweet Inspirations," as we watch the women discover purpose in their effort to

save a women's shelter from closing.

Lean deeper into God and less into our own desires, wants and resources.

The entire process tests the limits of their friendship and themselves. We, too, will face difficulties that require us to lean deeper into God and less into our own desires, wants and resources. Even when these moments are terrifying, we can find peace in Jesus.

The second lesson we see play out in "Sweet Inspirations" is that we are called to do good to

others. The women could have turned away from the shelter's needs, but instead they leaned in, sacrificed themselves in profound ways and helped live out Christ's command to love others.

Sometimes, loving others means more than merely sending a card or speaking a word of encouragement. It might mean heading down to a local soup kitchen or launching an effort like the women did to make a positive impact. Remember, our kind acts don't only impact those receiving them, but they also spark a desire in others to consider how they, too, can deepen their faith by loving others.

Hebrews 10:24 (NIV) reads, "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds." "Sweet Inspirations" gives us a spark from which to ignite the flames of good deeds in our own families and communities. Are you active in helping others? If not, start thinking about what you can do to make a positive, gospel-driven change.






